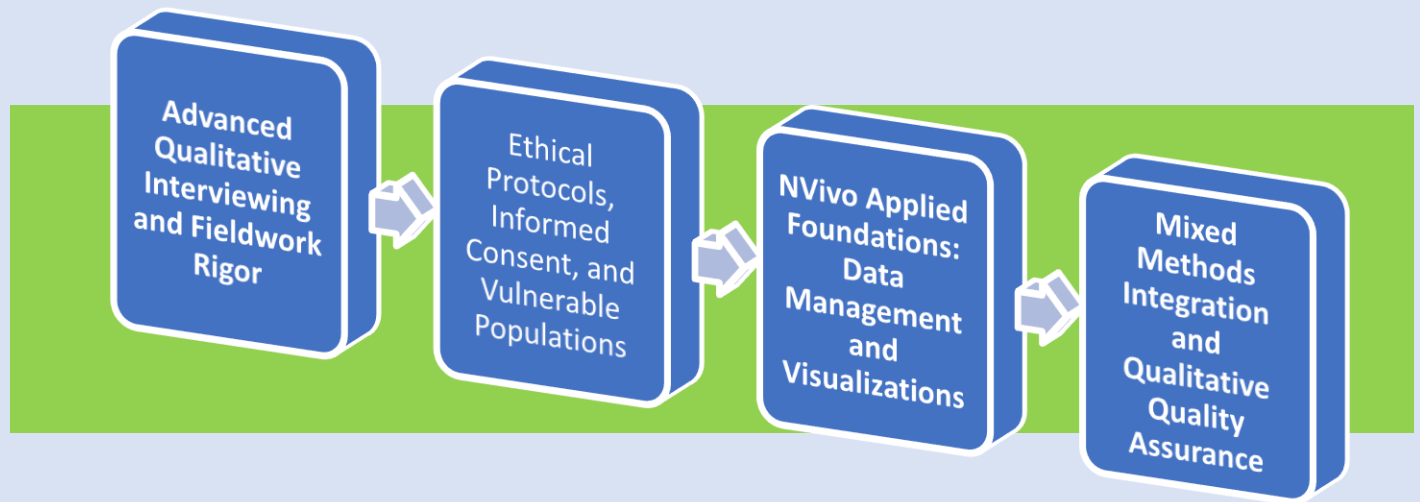

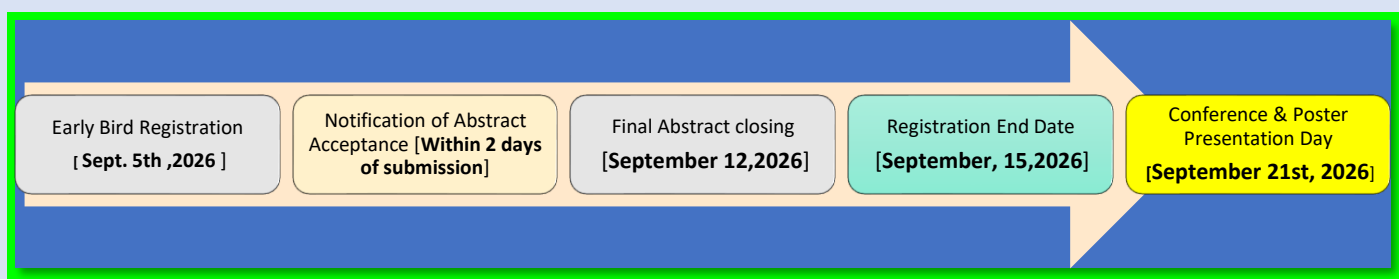

Step 1: Submit your Abstract through the following email- submission@swsc.edu.np

Step 2: Register yourself using Registration form

Step 3: Follow the guidelines to prepare poster for competition

Guidelines for Abstract Submission-

We welcome original, unpublished work aligned with the conference tracks. Authors may submit abstracts for either oral or poster presentation.

- **Word Limit:** Maximum of 250 words (excluding title, authors, and institutional affiliations).
- **Structural Elements:** Abstracts must follow a structured layout containing:
 - **Introduction:** Clear statement of the study's purpose or research question.

- **Methodology:** Explicit description of the qualitative approach, data collection tools, and analysis techniques used.
 - **Findings:** Summary of the core themes, insights, or expected outcomes.
 - **Conclusion:** The broader implications of the study for qualitative methodology or practice.
- **Keywords:** Include 3 to 5 precise keywords below the abstract text.
 - **Submission Format:** Submit via Microsoft Word (.doc or .docx) using 12pt Times New Roman font, double-spaced.
 - **Ethical Declaration:** A brief sentence confirming institutional review board (IRB) clearance or ethical compliance must be included if application

Guidelines for poster making-

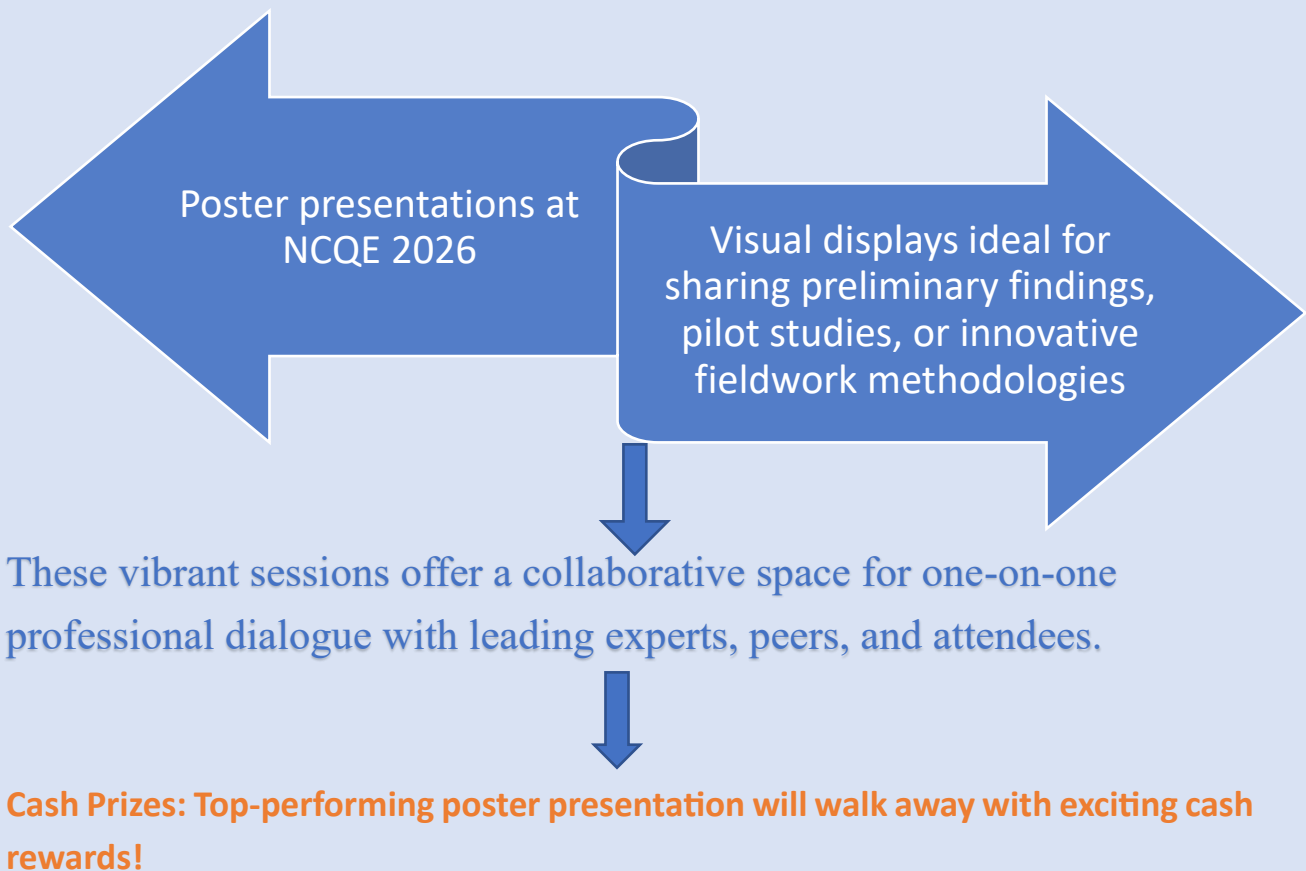
Poster Presentations: Dynamic visual displays ideal for sharing preliminary findings, pilot studies, or innovative fieldwork methodologies. Poster sessions offer a collaborative space for one-on-one professional dialogue with attendees.

Main Title:	Keep it short, striking, and informative. Use a bold font of at least 70 points so attendees can easily read it like a major newspaper headline from a distance.
Body Text:	Use clean, modern, sans-serif fonts such as Arial, Helvetica, or Verdana . Keep the text size between 24 and 32 points to ensure clear readability.
Logical Flow:	Arrange your sections in a clear, column-based path: Title \Background \ Methodology /Key Findings \Main Conclusion .
Short & Punchy:	Avoid long, dense paragraphs. Use bullet points and quick text fragments to keep your total word count under 1,000 words while steering clear of heavy academic jargon.
Graphics Over Text:	Use large, high-resolution charts, diagrams, or maps to display your data. Ensure all charts have clear headings, labeled axes, and easy-to-read legends.
